Training nights are usually held on Monday evenings and members of the public are welcome to come along and watch with prior notification. I am pleased to report on a recent meeting held between representatives of Torpoint Town Council and Cornwall Council about the arrival of Travellers at Horson Sports Field. Discussions are ongoing, but it is hoped that preventive measures will soon be in place to stop trespass happening again in the future, and if it should happen then a remedial action plan can be brought into immediately. I hope to provide an update on this matter in next month's column.

The Council is keen to pursue the possibility of CCTV coverage throughout Torpoint, resulting in a delegation of councillors making a visit to Tolvadden Control Centre to see for themselves the cameras in use, and how the surveillance can benefit the town from both a safety and security element. The Cornwall Fire, Rescue and Community Safety Service is based at Tolvaddon, Camborne and it is hoped that if installation takes place we will become part of a wider network of CCTV coverage

throughout South East Cornwall, which will be a great benefit to both our town and neighbouring communities.
