Penntorr Health Wellbeing Garden

The Wellbeing Garden is a beautiful outdoor space situated at the side of Penntorr Health Medical

Centre. It is surrounded by a wildflower meadow (when in season), facing westerly, overlooking HMS

Raleigh, with River Tamar views and beyond. We received £1500 funding from Public Health to create the disused space into a Wellbeing Garden with a picnic table, bench, flower planters and small garden

shrubs. Members of Penntorr Health Patient Participation Group, Torpoint Town Council and members

of staff from the Rame Group Practice guided by Permaculture Kenow, spent a few weekends clearing

the site to create the Wellbeing Garden.

The Garden is being used by staff at the practice to sit and relax during breaks and lunch periods and

the space is also being used for meetings and tutorials. Patients are also able to sit in the garden space

if they are waiting for their appointments or a bus. It provides a welcome green space for both patients

and staff alike.

We would like to purchase some more fruit trees and evergreen shrubs to provide both food and shade

to the garden and for them to also act as a wind break against the busy road.

We would also like to purchase another park bench to provide extra seating for meetings and group

work.

Our wish is to expand the garden in the future with raised beds which will enable us to grow more

edible crops.

It is a now well know that green space can reduce stress, which has been linked closely both to mental

and physical wellbeing. The Centre for Sustainable Healthcare highlight that in relation to the four

principles of sustainable healthcare, the natural environment contributes to the prevention of illness by increasing physical and mental wellbeing and offers people therapeutic benefits for recovery.
