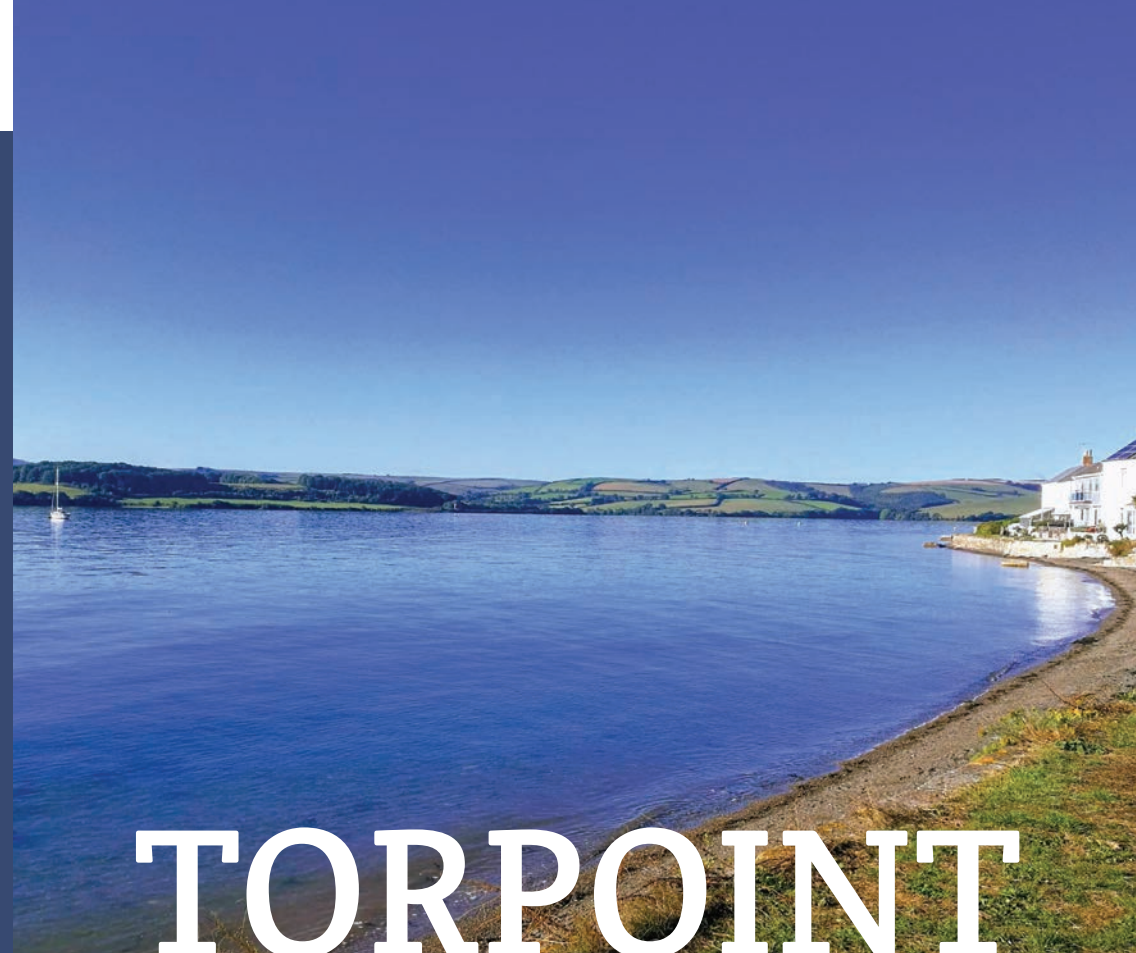

# LOCKDOWN STEPS

8 Mar

## STEP ONE A

All schools and college students back in class

Mandatory facemasks for secondary pupils

Some university students return

Two people from different households allowed outdoors

Care home residents allowed one visitor

29 Mar

## STEP ONE B

'Rule of six' allowed for outdoor gatherings

Outdoor sports facilities like tennis courts and golf courses re-open

'Stay at Home' replaced by 'Stay Local'

12 Apr

## STEP TWO

Non-essential retailers, hairdressers and close-contact services re-open

Pubs and restaurants can re-open for outdoor seated service

Libraries and outdoor attractions such as zoos and theme parks can re-open

Domestic holidays with family in self contained premises

Funerals with up to 30 people, weddings with up to 15

Wider social distancing rules remain in place

17 May

## STEP THREE

'Rule of six' scrapped outdoors

Indoor hospitality re-opens, cinemas, soft play areas, rest of accommodation sector

Possible return of international travel

Smaller outdoor sports venues allowed 4,000 fans or half capacity (whichever is lower)

Up to 10,000 people or a quarter of capacity - allowed at stadiums holding 16,000 people or more (whichever is lower)

## STEP FOUR

Last remaining legal restrictions lifted

Remaining hospitality re-opens

Nightclubs can re-open

Large events and performances can restart with full crowds

Restrictions for weddings may still be in effect

# TOWN VITALITY FUNDING

Torpoint Town Council have secured £50k of Cornwall Council Vitality Funding following a successful submission to the Town Centre Revitalisation Fund.

Following a town council initiative to create a Vision and masterplan in parallel with the ongoing work on the Neighbourhood Development Plan, the funds will progress development opportunities at the lower end of the town.

The town council will work in partnership with Cornwall Council to allocate resources to fund appropriate professional work including project management, design and feasibility and commercial advice.

Additionally, funding will be utilised for bid writing and expertise, all seeking to re-vitalise the town centre.

The outcomes will be a set of surveys and project documentation to support a Strategic Outline Case for further funding.

A constituted Town Team Advisory Group is being established and this partnership group will provide the delivery vehicle to enable the strategy for the development of Lower Fore Street to be facilitated.

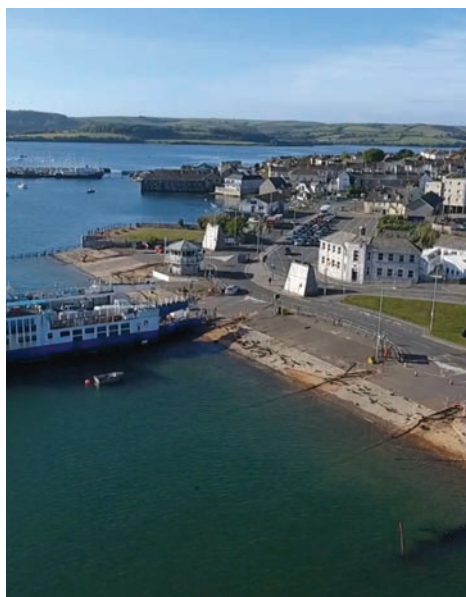
A strong Project Manager will be appointed to formulate a clear, coherent, costed plan with likely delivery partners, housing, retail, public sector requirements, along with the Police and other stakeholders.

Councillor Tim Dwelly, Cornwall Council cabinet portfolio holder for economy, said;

*“Torpoint Town Council and the local community have a great vision for the future of their town and this funding is the catalyst they need to make their plans a reality.”*

*Our Town Vitality Fund aims to help towns to rethink their centres by working up truly deliverable projects for future investment that will improve town centre vitality, making them places where the community wants to live and work.”*

# PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS FOR LOCAL PARKS

Planned improvements to local parks and tennis courts are now safeguarded for generations to come.

In January 2021 Cornwall Council transferred ownership of Cambridge Field, Chestnut Close play area, Borough Farm play area, Thanckes Park play area and the tennis courts in Thanckes Park to Torpoint Town Council.

This is a really exciting opportunity for the Council to work with the community to create great spaces for everyone to enjoy.

To enable the Grounds Maintenance team to support these improvements, a Town Council hybrid vehicle will soon be seen around the town – please give them a wave!

We hope the community will see these improvements by May 2021.

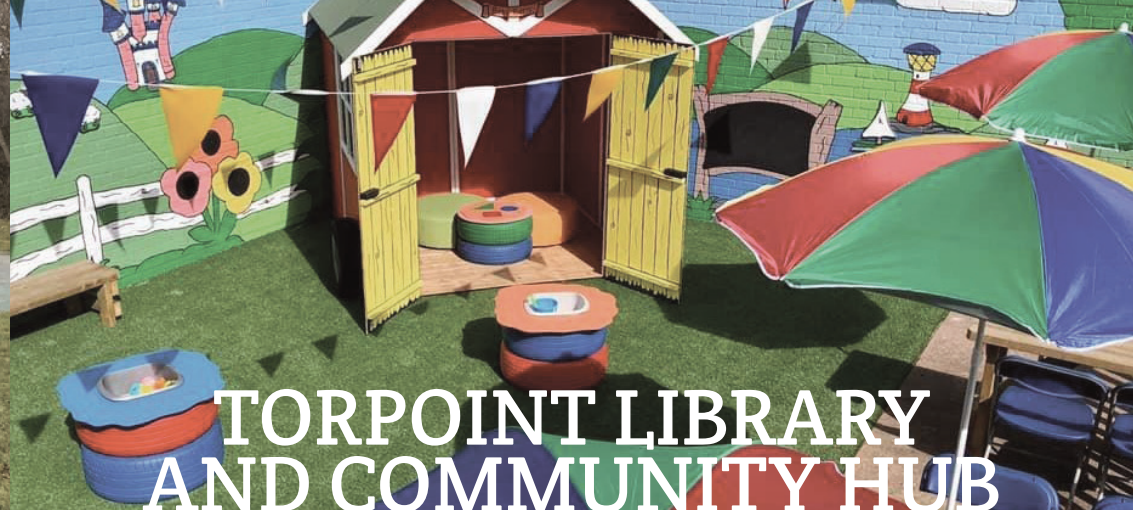

**There will be a phased approach to updating these areas and we plan to start off with the following improvements:**

- Installation of fencing, nets and posts at the tennis courts.
- Replacement of some play equipment at Borough Farm play area.
- Installation of wooden fencing at Chestnut Close play area.
- Installation of a 'Camel springie' at Thanckes Park play area. The Friends of Thanckes Park group are planning to provide funding towards the installation of a trampoline here too.
- Installation of picnic benches.
- Installation of signs at all parks.
- Installation of a second accessible entrance at Cambridge Field.
