Good Afternoon Catherine,

As you know from Milly the Adela road Project is still on going. Due to Covid, we have been unable to lay the turf which we were kindly granted the funding for.

In the meantime an issue of child safety has arisen on the road due to excess speed on the new road surface. The residents have crowd funded £260, but the cost from Cormac to carry out the works is £580 plus vat.

As safety is always at the forefront of our minds, we wondered if Cornwall Council would sanction us using the funds granted for turf for the safety signage instead?
