We have reached a stage where we would very much welcome help from the Council in publicising the forthcoming survey, and in identifying key people in the parish organisations etc who might be able to help in the coming weeks.

volunteers (maybe overlapping the above) - who will be needed during the survey itself - to distribute flyers / surveys - door to door, near shops, at the train station, at ferries etc + encouragement to get people to fill it in, continuing with contact with local groups, briefing and encouraging people and groups as necessary

Assist printed copy respondents - e,g, by scribing; Collecting completed printed returns Putting up posters or exhibitions (Torpoint library, for example have agreed to an exhibition or display - what about churches, clubs etc?)..

St Germans & Rame Integrated Public Transport Scheme: Progress Report

Since October, we have consulted various stakeholders - Cornwall Council, parish councils, Go Cornwall Bus, GWR, Devon & Cornwall Rail Partnership, as well as having discussions at the Rame Peninsula Public Transport Users Group and the St Germans & Area Public Transport Group.

We have received funding from the Cornwall Council Community Chest, the St Germans, Deviock, Sheviock and Millbrook Parish Councils, from St Germans Community Shop, and from GWR. We are continuing to seek funds from a number of other organisations. We have been reviewing the literature on patterns of public transport development, the integration of systems, government and local authority policies, and passenger use. There has been a consultation with experts at Plymouth University, and time has been allocated to a member of university staff to work on the project. Various types of surveys and survey platforms have been investigated in order to select the most appropriate approach. A careful consideration of ethical issues has been made, as part of our commitment to protect our communities from harm, and we are ensuring that our work conforms to ethical standards. These include the promise of anonymity, confidentiality and the right to withdraw data up to analysis stage, and conformity to GDPR.

A draft questionnaire has been produced, and this is in the process of being piloted - both in electronic and paper formats. The results, including comments and advice from the participants, will be considered at the end of this month and a final version of the survey will be agreed. A researcher has been identified, and is expected to begin work at the end of February.

We expect the survey to go live at that stage, and we hope that during March and April we will receive a good number of responses throughout the area, with proportional representation from each locality in the wider Rame peninsula. Participation in the survey will be voluntary. To maximise response, extensive field work will be carried out over the six week survey period with a view to gaining support from the local communities across ages. We aim to 'create a buzz'!

With the support of local individuals and community groups, work will be carried out in four stages 'pre launch', 'launch', 'reminders' and 'final follow up'. Thus, from now on we hope that Parish Councils and others will help to encourage support from various groups and organisations throughout the survey area..

Future pattern of work

During the survey, and in the subsequent weeks the questionnaire will be coded and all numerical data will be imported into a statistical software package for analysis by our experienced researcher. Descriptive data will provide information relevant to each of the project's aims. We will explore whether there are any trends in the results by locality or age. Qualitative data will be explored for key themes. These will then be quantified and cross referenced with the rest of the data. Reports will be provided to local communities via local newspapers, council websites, radio and TV. These reports will be sent to parish and county councils, community transport network agencies and transport providers. As public transport groups representing our local communities, we intend to use the work from this survey to continue to press for developments in public transport into the future.
