## CC Report for Town Council Meeting 17 March 2022

This report covers the period 12 February to 11 March to ensure the report can be seen by all town councillors with all other council papers prior to the above meeting.

Discussions are still ongoing as regards the Free Car Park at The Lawn, I have suggested that a site meeting take place so we can expedite a final plan.

Again, more cases have been reported through the Casework Assist programme. A follow up on one particular case reported in December has now resulted in action being taken this forthcoming Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March, fingers crossed!

The current round of Cornwall Councillor Community Chest Grants (CCCCG) has now closed and as can be seen by the attached the majority has been allocated to various Youth Groups within Torpoint. Although the CCCCG is an excellent source of financial aid to local communities any funding grant must meet certain conditions and as such can be restrictive in its allocation. With that in mind, further monies have been made available for other causes outside the qualifying criteria to the tune of £2,905:98 during the last year. A further £3,500:00 has been ringfenced for completion of other projects within Torpoint over the next couple of months. The overall intention is to make £10,000:00, inclusive of the CCCCF grant available annually for use in any way that benefits both residents and the town of Torpoint.

\* The Director of Children's Services read out a truly heart rending statement from a young Kurdish teenager who described his journey across Europe from Turkey following a gas attack on his village (where he was one of the few survivors) and his rescue from that atrocity by Kurdish rebels, his time in the jungle in Calais, the sinking of his inflatable in the English Channel and this time being rescued by British Border Force. He was allocated a Foster home in Bodmin and is now studying at Callywick College.

As reported in February I have had to escalate my request for a copy of a Cornwall Housing walkround report (undertaken in October) as this is still not forthcoming and the next walkround is due in April.
