## LIBRARY AND COMMUNITY HUB REPORT

**Income and expenditure**. Please access the income and expenditure documents for July and August 2022.

August footfall. During the period 1-28 August, the average footfall was 193 per day open.

**Ant infestations**. The café was closed to the public for three days, and the entire building for one day during August, due to ant infestations. A pest control company have hopefully eliminated for now, what has been a historic and reoccurring problem.

**Local Devolution Funding (LDF)**. Six wooden backless benches for the children's play area at the rear of the building were delivered on Fri 12 August. The bird box and reading/writing sheds plus shelter (for Thanckes Park), are all due to arrive early September.

**Summer Reading Challenge**. The number of children taking part in the Summer Reading Challenge is considerably down on previous years. Despite the footfall from children 4-11 years being high, interest from those same children in taking part in the challenge has been low.

**Warm Banks in Cornwall.** NHS Sustainability have suggested that a network of library buildings could be created to help support the community once the weather becomes colder. These "Warm Banks" would also provide NHS health checks and support services. The Town Clerk & RFO and CH&LDM are due to attend a virtual meeting to further discuss this initiative on Wednesday 31 August.

**Torpoint Youth Club**. The CH&LDM has contacted Carla at the Torpoint Youth Club regarding arranging a date for the club to visit the library on a Thursday evening.
