Regulation 14 Consultation Torpoint Neighbourhood Plan



Torpoint Town Council, supported by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, has prepared a Neighbourhood Plan for the Torpoint Parish.

The plan sets out a vision for the future and outlines the planning policies which will be used to determine local planning proposals. Comments are invited on the proposals in this pre-submission before being submitted to Cornwall Council for formal consideration and wider consultation.

Civic Service & Parade 2023

The community of Torpoint excelled themselves on Sunday 16th July with a fantastic turnout for the annual Civic Service and Parade.

Led by Torpoint Sea Cadets – T S Ramehead Cadet Band, Mayor and Mayoress of Torpoint Councillor Gary Davis and Mrs Victoria Davis were accompanied by the Town Mayor's Deputy Consort Master George Davis, Deputy Mayor Councillor Mrs Julie Martin and Consort Andy Martin.

Dignitaries attending included the High Sheriff of Cornwall Toby Ashworth, Commanding Officer Captain Jane Roe from HMS RALEIGH and Sheryll Murray MP accompanied by Bob Davidson. Councillor Pauline Giles, Chairman of Cornwall Council accompanied by her Consort, also the Plymouth Lord Mayor accompanied by the Plymouth Lady Mayoress. Also, visiting Mayor's from Launceston and Saltash, the Deputy Mayor and Portreeve from Callington, plus the Deputy Mayor of Liskeard. Honorary Freeman of Torpoint Mike Pearn MBE, Honorary Burgess of Torpoint John Crago, the Chairman of Antony Parish Council, the Chairman of Sheviock Parish Council, plus the Vice Chairman of Millbrook Parish Council were supported by Torpoint Town Councillors, the Town Crier, plus Cornwall Councillors Kate Ewert and John Tivnan BEM. Additionally, former Town Mayors attended and paraded to the Church.

The Reverend Michael Woodall, the Mayor's Chaplain and the Reverend Annabel King led the Service at St. James Church, with a beautiful performance from the children from Torpoint Nursery and Infant School.

Councillor Rachel Evans BEM presented the Civic Awards for 2023. Friends of Thanckes Park was awarded the Organisation of the Year, for successfully organising a myriad of events and collaborating with other organisations, ensuring that our wide and diverse community continue to enjoy and benefit from one of Torpoint's real gems, the Field in Trust, Thanckes Park.

The Person of Courage Award was awarded to Katie-Marie Martin. Councillor Evans explained that 18 months ago this beautiful young lady was about to embark on an exciting new promotion in a job she adored when, unexpectedly, she became unwell. Unfortunately she was diagnosed with a spinal tumour known as Sacral Chordoma. For those of you that do













not know, Chordoma is a cancer, diagnosed in one in a million people around the world, more commonly aged 40-75! She was 23!

Councillor Evans has sponsored a new Youth Achievement Award, as during her years as Mayor, she recognised there are many young people in our community quietly doing great things and she wanted to continue to encourage them to be the best they can. Awarding Ernie Eastment the award, Councillor Evans highlighted that Ernie is a great Ambassador for young people in our town, someone who constantly displays values such as integrity, respect and care. As a Special Patrol Leader in the Scouts, he has been described as the epitome of a great Scout, a valuable team player who is extremely supportive of his peers and leaders.

The Citizen of the Year Award was presented to Jenny Hughes, who is always first in the queue when it comes to volunteering, tirelessly putting herself forward to help any organisation that needs an extra pair of hands, as well as organising many fundraising events themselves. Over the years Jenny has raised thousands of pounds for a variety of organisations and charities and has been the lead fundraiser and champion of getting life-saving defibrillators across Torpoint. Jenny has devoted over 27 years to the Scouts, giving young people an opportunity to enjoy fun and adventure whilst developing skills to last them a life time.

The Mayor said "Thank you to everyone for coming along today and supporting my Civic Service and the procession through the town. I am immensely proud of everyone in our community and all the organisations they represented." Summarising the projects currently being undertaken in the town, the Mayor explained the church collection will be going towards the Mustard Tree and All-Weather Pitch project.

On Saturday 15th July 2023 Torpoint Town Crier David Green took part in The Ancient and Honourable Guild of Town Criers Annual Championship Competition in Calne, Wiltshire. Twenty-eight Town Criers from across the UK and from Australia, Bermuda and Canada, too presented a First Cry of 'My home town' and a Second Cry with the theme 'Cry me a river.' Having competed for and won awards in local Crier Competitions, this was David's first Guild Championship attendance and first competition representing Torpoint. He was eligible for entry to the prestigious National Award of the Bob Walker Trophy and took 1st Place.

A Message from the Torpoint and Rame Community Nurses Friends

It is with a mixture of sadness and delight that we wish to inform everyone that Torpoint & Rame Community Nurses Friends have been dissolved after 34 years.

This charity began in 1989 in response to Margaret Hall, community nurse, commenting to her friends that she was frustrated by the lack of resources for the patients she was caring for, in particular the difficulty in supplying commodes!

From this came the inspiration to create a fundraising group to purchase equipment for all NHS Community staff, Nurses, Midwives, Health Visitors, Speech Therapists and Physiotherapists.

So the charity was formed and has raised enormous sums of money over the years, much of it donated by grateful relatives of patients, but also through regular fund raising events in the local area. There have been many people, both NHS workers and others who have given their time, enthusiasm and energy to keep the charity going.

The money has been used to purchase a wide variety of items ranging from simple items such as books for educational purposes used by the

Health Visiting team, to specialist beds for two disabled children. Also, a specialist therapy bike for the physios to expedite recovery from hip and knee surgery, and numerous items of equipment to improve patient care by the Community nurses such as syringe drivers and nebulisers and of course lots of commodes!

However, times change and amazingly the charity is now in a situation where each NHS Trust supplies all necessary equipment and due to infection control regulations, items are not reused in the same way they used to be, so the services are no longer needed.

The charity was left with £4,400 in funds which, according to the Charity Commission and our Constitution had to be given to health-related charities. It has therefore been donated to the Lions to purchase wheelchairs to loan out, to CHAT for the Dementia Group and supplementing the Food Box scheme which was started during the Covid lockdown.

Grateful thanks to anyone and everyone who has contributed to this worthwhile charity, either financially or by giving their time and commitment along the way.

LOWER FORE STREET REDEVELOPMENT

In 2022, the Town Team Project Board, which includes the Town Council, Antony Estate, third sector organisations and local businesses, produced a Strategic Outline Case for the development of Lower Fore Street. This project continues this work and supports the delivery of a RIBA (Royal Institute of British Architects) 2 report and feasibility study to develop a community focused facility and housing at the centre of Torpoint. The development site represents the first/last impression of visitors to Cornwall through this gateway and is the focus for mixed use development and public realm enhancement. It is at the centre of 'A Vision for Torpoint', published in March 2016, and is the basis for the Economic Plan and the Neighbourhood Plan.

The project will provide a combined community and housing development overlooking the River Tamar, adjacent to the ferry lanes and at the base of the main shopping street.

The development will contain visitor and transport information, work space for officers, a community hub and library, café, gallery, art and creative studios, office and business start-up units for rent, as well as flexible work space for all sector use. There is also the opportunity to provide up to 50 x 2/3 bedroom apartments providing better living standards and much needed homes in the area.

The aim is to create a community focused building bringing the community together, restoring a sense of pride in Torpoint, creating a visible focus for the town, bringing to life the Vision for Torpoint. The facility will support networking and a creative mix of people from all ages enabling development, increased skills, stronger community and a more prosperous future for all. Importantly it will also enable people of all ages to mix, generating an environment that will help with the increased levels of loneliness identified in Torpoint.
