# 135-23 Correspondence: -

- a) Notice of Polling Districts and Polling Places Review Cornwall Council: Noted.
- b) Public Consultation October 2023 Funding the Crossings Tamar Crossings: It was agreed by members' to debate the town council's response to the public consultation at this meeting and there was much debate on the matter. There were comments from Councillors Mrs. J L Reeves, C R Sawyer, R M Willoughby, the Deputy Mayor (Councillor Mrs. J M Martin), M Thomson-Neall, the Chairman (Councillor G J Davis), Mrs. L Fellows plus M J Spurling.

Following a proposal put by Chairman (Councillor G J Davis) and seconded by Councillor C R Still it is **resolved** to delegate to the Clerk to reply to the consultation for and on behalf of the town council with the statement: - "Torpoint Town Council strongly oppose any option which separates the Tamar Bridge and Torpoint Ferry tolls and anticipates a significant unknown impact, socially and economically to human behaviour for Torpoint and the Rame Peninsula. The 24/7 Torpoint Ferry service is an essential life-saving service that should be maintained."

## **136-23** Reports

a) Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) – update on the Regulation 14 consultation.

The NDP Regulation 14 consultation is continuing until 5pm on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

b) Torpoint Town Partnership (TTP): -

The Deputy Mayor (Councillor Mrs. J M Martin) explained the TTP had last met on 10<sup>th</sup> October. Fundraising towards the Christmas lights in the town had now exceeded £900. The Christmas tree, to be positioned at Eliot Square had been selected by Councillors Mrs. K Bownhill and J Tivnan BEM, with the Torpoint Players agreeing to sponsor the Christmas tree this year. Information on the shop window competition will shortly be circulated to local traders and the annual Christmas lantern making



workshop is planned for Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> November at the Council Chambers. Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> November is the Christmas lights switch-on event; there will be stalls, a lantern parade, plus entertainment with a visit from Father Christmas, who will then be in 'Bob's Barn' at Torpoint Library and Community Hub after the lights are switched on. Father Christmas will also be in 'Bob's Barn' the following day, on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November.

The Chairman (Councillor G J Davis) recorded his thanks to Councillors Brownhill and Tivnan for choosing the Christmas tree this year.

c) Town Team Project Board (TTPB) - To accept the minutes of the TTPB meeting held Wednesday  $11^{\rm th}$  October 2023: -

The minutes had not been circulated in advance of this meeting. The Chairman gave a very brief update on the towns opportunity for the possible introduction of 'Beryl Bikes', explaining there has been no decision made on this yet.

d) Reports from delegates to outside bodies.

# i) TAHC report September 2023: -

In addition to the report from the Torpoint Archives and Heritage Centre, Councillor Mrs. K Brownhill added that TAHC wished to record that they are extremely grateful to the town council for the Section 137 grant which had recently been received. Additionally, Councillor Brownhill has reassured the members about their inclusion in any redevelopment opportunities at the Lower end of Fore Street.

ii) Rame Peninsula Public Transport User Group (RPPTUG): -

Councillor Mrs. C E Goodman explained, having recently attended the RPPTUG meeting at Antony Village Hall on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October, Richard Stephens MBE from Go South West had attended. Unfortunately, Mr James Church has been made redundant from the organisation. Councillor Goodman continued, saying that James would be deeply missed, highlighting the support he has given to the RPPTUG group over the years. Members' **resolved** to send a letter thanking Mr Church, for his significant efforts in the matter of assisting with queries, supporting and guiding on the key changes in the provision of public (bus) transport in and around Torpoint and the Rame Peninsula.
