

South East Cornwall CAP - Town & Parish Council update reports

Town/Parish Council: Torpoint Town Council

Transport & Connectivity:

Community Levelling Up grant funding project: Torpoint Integrated Travel Network (TITAN). Feasibility studies for the delivery of six Mobility Hubs in Torpoint and on the Rame Peninsula were completed to RIBA 2 standard, the sites were identified by Cormac in their redevelopment and regeneration transport strategy for the area. The document provides the potential opportunities and risks, alongside designs and costings, given engagement undertaken with key stakeholders, this project is now complete.

Next steps will be to submit future funding bids, to progress two mobility hubs to the next stage of implementation.

Economic Development & Housing:

Funding secured from the Good Growth Fund to supply a RIBA 2 Feasibility Study for Torpoint Lower Fore Street Community Building, located at the 'old Police Station' site. The document has been considered and now adopted and provides development options and a preferred development scheme for the site.

An application for Town Accelerator Funding, for the 25% uplift on the town's original Town Vitality Funding has been submitted, to support the delivery of an initial visitor website for a period of two years, a decision is awaited.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan has been submitted to Cornwall Council and is currently undergoing legal compliance.

Climate Change & Nature Recovery:

The town council has worked closely with Forest for Cornwall, Urban and Community tree planting team, seeking feedback from local residents' on various tree planting locations in the town. Tree planting is ongoing with engagement from the local community.

Health & Deprivation:

In November 2023 the town council and the LTA announced a partnership to invest in and refurbish public park tennis courts. Two tennis courts are being renovated, with investment of £60,000 helping ensure that quality facilities are available for the local community. The project is part of a nationwide investment by the UK Government and LTA Tennis Foundation, delivered by the LTA, to refurbish public tennis courts across Great Britain, and open up the sport to many more people.

Any other issues:
