Torpoint Town Council launched the completely refurbished courts in Thanckes Park on the 27th April this year after partnering with us on the Lawn Tennis Association / DCMS investment project. The council has been working with us over the last two years to bring the underutilised and poor condition courts back to life. Investing in partnership with the programme the courts are now completely refurbished surfaces and gate access system alongside previous council investment into new fencing. The council organised a superb launch event with dignitaries, local players and the MP to ensure awareness was raised that these courts were open for booking. The courts have seen over 1000 bookings since April and sold just under 100 affordable household passes to local residents. The council staff have actively sort to activate the courts and open tennis up through working with wider organisations to supply equipment for play and facilitate those with disabilities to be able to use the courts through accessibility projects. The council have recruited activators for Free Park Tennis in preparation for this being added to the programme next year. Cornwall has comparatively few public facilities like this - and the council vision and commitment to the development of tennis in Torpoint is hugely impressive and vital to open tennis up to more people in South East Cornwall.
