Many thanks for your email to the Commissioner, Alison Hernandez, I have been asked to respond on her behalf.

With regards to your proposal for funding CCTV to be installed at Harvey Street flats in Torpoint, our office is currently drawing up plans for CCTV funding for next year and we will be sharing further details to all local councils in due course.

The Commissioner also funds an annual Community Grant Fund which is opening for new applications on 1st September and this year's theme is: *Prevention and reduction of shoplifting and burglary*. I would advise you to look out for further details of this grant scheme via the Cornwall Community Foundation who facilitate the grant process on our behalf (see link to their website below).

CCTV Harvey Street

Further to our meeting yesterday afternoon, following a walk around Harvey Street flats towards the end of 2024, here is a brief summary of considerations/next steps for the proposal to install CCTV overlooking Harvey Street flats.

1. Likely location would be 2 cameras positioned on Rowe Street, overlooking the rear of Harvey Street flats buildings.
2. Landowner permission would be required.
3. Funding is required. Information shared below, highlights an estimate of costs for the Saltash proposal, without monitoring £14,416.00 (plus VAT). John is already in conversation with Alison Hernandez on funding for the CCTV proposal and will follow this up in due course PROPOSAL A – ACTION John
4. Consider what monitoring costs of the CCTV would be (from Plymouth) and include these costs in a PROPOSAL B – ACTION Hayley
5. Should other income sources be required, these can be investigated.
6. Consider who would manage the project, taking ownership of the cameras and equipment, yearly insurance as well as annual maintenance and monitoring expenditure. Should this be the town council, then a Project Initiation Document and all other information would be need to be presented to the Development and Localism committee for consideration. There is currently no funding in the council's budget and it does not appear in the council's Action Plan or Town Council Strategy.

Hoping this summarises the discussion, the group will meet again, once John has further news on funding.

c) To update on the investigation into the installation of CCTV in Harvey Street: -
Pursuant to minute 107-24F&O (m), Councillor J Tivnan BEM [in his capacity as Cornwall

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Councillor] was pleased to advise that he had taken the [recent] opportunity to discuss the CCTV on the flats in Harvey Street 'proposition' with Alison Hernandez, Devon and Cornwall Police and Crime Commissioner. Councillor Tivnan detailed further incidents of anti-social behaviour occurring in the vicinity of Harvey Street flats, which in his opinion, support the need. Councillor Tivnan continued, he has a meeting scheduled with Cornwall Housing the day after this meeting. The Clerk had organised a meeting with Councillor Tivnan, PC Gething and the Operations Manager to consider a way forward with the Clerk highlighting there are many 'hurdles' to consider, before this council would be presented with a Project Initiation Document. The Town Mayor (Councillor G J Davis) highlighted, should this proposal be brought to the council, it should include all costings as well as a clear rationale for the CCTV installation, as the landowner is Cornwall Housing, stating this should be their project.
