39-25D&L Library and Community Hub	
a) Newsletter from the Library and Community Hub and additional report: -	
The Community Hub and Library Development Manager presented the newsletter and report and	
summarised the 3 month trial opening on Saturday mornings. Members' accepted and all agreed	
that although there had been different activities offered to encourage footfall, there is insufficient	
new demand from customers to warrant opening every Saturday morning. Facility will revert to	CH&LDM
opening on the second Saturday of every month, as well as the last Sunday of every month. The	
option to open late one evening per week will be explored by the CH&LDM.

a) Tennis courts: -	
Pursuant to minute number 28-25D&L (a), the Clerk had shared the updated LTA/council action	Clerk
plan, following a meeting held earlier the same week. Lapsed memberships were discussed and it	
is agreed that when the next Free Park Tennis dates are known and advertised, lapsed members'	
should be contacted, as a reminder to renew. Following a question put regarding whether	
floodlighting should be considered to be installed at the courts, it is suggested to contact the	
Friends of Thanckes Park group initially, to ascertain whether the installation of floodlighting would	
impact on the bats in Thanckes Park.	
b) Torpoint Skate Park to consider the next steps, to receive draft Invitation to Tender (ITT) ,	
agree changes and panel members for selection process: -	
Pursuant to minute number 23-25D&L (a) the Chairman Councillor G J Davis minuted thanks to	
Torpoint Ramps Forum for sharing the draft tender for consideration. In light of comments from

the Clerk, expressing concern about the timeline for issue slipping, whilst wishing to ensure the ITT is 'in keeping' with previous ITT's the council has issued, it is <b>recommended</b> to delegate to the Clerk to work with Torpoint Ramps Forum to prepare the ITT ready for issue. Panel members sitting on the selection process should include Torpoint Ramps Forum, councillors, plus the Clerk. c) Accessible play equipment project and parks survey results: - Pursuant to minute 32-25D&L (a) the accessible play project is progressing, with the Invitation to Tender issued. The play parks survey results were discussed at length and it is agreed that further discussion on the future of the play parks and their ongoing improvement should be made at the October budget setting meeting, of this committee.  d) Horson Field project: - The Chairman (Councillor G J Davis) gave an update on the Horson Field project and highlighted he is awaiting correspondence from the Cornwall FA representative. Details of the successful funding bid were shared along with next steps. Questions around the possibility of the Footpath being re-instating, also the possibility of a cricket pitch, were asked. Permissions for Thanckes Park are taking some time, however, it is anticipated that a 'water survey' at a cost of	
£1,000.00 will soon be undertaken by South West Water.
