Tamar Bridge

Tamar Bridge tolls will be suspended from 0000 on 25th December 2025 until 2359 on 25th December 2025 (midnight to midnight).

The Bridge will be open as usual throughout the Christmas and New Year period.

Drivers are requested to approach the toll plaza and pass through the booths with care, as there may occasionally be Bridge staff crossing behind the toll booths.

Torpoint Ferry

Torpoint Ferry tolls will be suspended from 0000 on 25th December 2025 until 2359 on 25th December 2025 (midnight to midnight).

Barring adverse weather conditions, the following ferry schedule will operate over the Christmas and New Year periods:


The night service, that runs from 22:00 to 06:00, remains unchanged (seven nights a week) throughout the whole period and is a half hourly service, on the hour and half hour from Torpoint, and quarter to and quarter past the hour from Devonport.

<u>Wednesday 24th December</u> (Christmas Eve) – 2 ferry service from 06:30 to 2100 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

<u>Thursday 25th December</u> (Christmas Day) - one ferry / half hourly service will operate all day and all night.

<u>Friday 26th December</u> (Boxing Day) - 2 ferry / fifteen-minute service from 06.30 to 18:30 – thereafter a one ferry / half hourly service will operate

<u>Saturday 27th December</u> – 2 ferry service from 06:30 to 2100 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.



<u>Sunday 28th December</u> – 2 ferry service from 08:00 to 18:00 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

Monday 29th December – 2 ferry service from 06:30 to 18:30 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

<u>Tuesday 30th December</u> – 2 ferry service from 06:30 to 18:30 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

<u>Wednesday 31 December</u> – 2 ferry service from 06:30 to 18:30 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

<u>Thursday 1st January</u> (New Years Day) – 2 ferry service from 09:30 to 18:30 thereafter a half hourly service will operate.

<u>Friday 2nd January</u> onwards – normal winter weekday service resumes.

Visitor and Learning Centre

The Visitor and Learning Centre will be open every day during the Christmas and New Year period except for Christmas Day.

Notes to editor:

The Tamar Bridge and Torpoint Ferry Joint Committee is a local government committee formed by five councillors from each of the two Joint Authorities, Plymouth City Council and Cornwall Council. A special coalition between these two authorities began in 1950, when together they constructed a bridge across the lower reaches of the Tamar to secure the prosperity of the region. The Joint Authorities also took the opportunity to acquire joint possession of the Torpoint Ferry, at the time owned solely by Cornwall County Council, putting the control of these two vital local crossings of the Tamar together under the control of one governing body.

The Visitor and Learning Centre, Bridging the Tamar, opened in 2019 and showcases the heritage of both the 20th century Tamar Bridge and Brunel's iconic 19th century Royal Albert Bridge.

The Tamar Bridge and Torpoint Ferry remain critical components of the region's transport infrastructure helping to safeguard the economic wellbeing of Plymouth and South East Cornwall.
