Hello and welcome to this quarter's newsletter.

As I am writing this the news of Plymouth YMCA pulling out of the management of Torpoint and Rame Community Sports Centre has just landed, and although we have no direct involvement Torpoint Town Council has offered support to both Torpoint YMCA and Torpoint Community College, to help them find a way forward in order to retain this facility for the community. Our support is also offered to all three of our schools as they currently navigate how to move forward successfully with significantly less children attending and therefore less funding to provide the education our children deserve.



Highlights in this newsletter include the event I hosted to celebrate the adoption of the Neighbourhood Plan. This is a significant achievement for our town and will inform planning decisions, protect our green spaces and bring in additional funding. Also included is news on the launch of Torpoint's first Arts and Culture Strategy; a town wide plan to develop the arts and culture on offer in our community.

The Mayor's Charity fund this year is supporting the Council's Accessible Play Equipment Project and the Cornerstone Church building fund. I am pleased to report that at the time of writing this we are only £964.10 short of the £30,000 target. Accessible play equipment is currently being installed at Cambridge Field and Borough Park and I am planning an official opening day later in March to ensure it is all safe and ready for use by the Easter holidays.

Our very successful Library and Community Hub is hosting welcome days over the next four months as detailed on the advert included in this newsletter. If you've never visited before, this is your opportunity to go along and see what is on offer.

Torpoint launches its first Arts & Culture Strategy [imagining a creative future for the town]

Torpoint unveiled its first ever Arts & Culture Strategy, marking a new chapter in the town's creative story. The launch event, hosted by Torpoint Artists Collective CIC (TAC) and Torpoint Town Council (TTC), brought together artists, Councillors, local changemakers and members of the community to celebrate the shared vision of a more creative Torpoint.

The event at 61 Fore Street offered a first look at the strategy - a town-wide plan developed through months of consultation with residents, schools, community groups and local businesses. Guests were invited to explore an accompanying exhibition that captured what a creative Torpoint could look and feel like: vibrant, connected and proud of its people and place.

The Arts Strategy showcase then opened to the wider public across the weekend (Friday 30th until Sunday 1st February 2026), inviting everyone to see and contribute to Torpoint's growing creative energy. Developed with support from cultural consultant Lizzie Hilton, the strategy draws directly from the voices of Torpoint residents. Over 90% of survey respondents agreed that new arts spaces would benefit the town, and 92% said they would support an annual arts festival. From visual arts and theatre to music, digital creativity, and public art, the strategy paints a vision for how arts and culture can strengthen wellbeing, inclusion, and civic pride.

"Creativity is fundamental to a community's existence and wellbeing. Without it, it stagnates and dies," said one resident during consultation - a sentiment echoed by many.

The strategy also connects directly with the Vision for Torpoint 2010-2030 and the Neighbourhood Plan, identifying opportunities for new multi-use creative spaces and partnerships. It sets out the first steps toward building a Creative Torpoint Network, appointing a Cultural Producer, and initiating community-led arts projects.

Torpoint Artists Collective CIC director Matthew Pontin said:

"This strategy belongs to everyone who took the time to imagine what arts and culture in Torpoint could be. The ideas, hopes and creativity that went into this process show that Torpoint's cultural future is already here - it just needs space to grow. And a huge thanks to everyone that volunteered time into this work"

Town Mayor, Councillor Julie Martin, said:

"Torpoint Town Council is supportive and proud of the work that has been undertaken to create TAC CIC's Arts and Culture Strategy for Torpoint. The Strategy recognises the value of arts and culture to the people of Torpoint, and provides a road map of how we can work together with Torpoint Artists Collective CIC and key stakeholders to grow and develop this in the future."

Torpoint Neighbourhood Plan is approved - January 2026



On Thursday 29th January, Torpoint Town Mayor Councillor Julie Martin hosted an event at the Council Chambers, to celebrate and thank all those who have been involved with the development of the Torpoint Neighbourhood Plan.

Those attending the event included Councillors, Honorary Freeman of Torpoint Mike Pearn MBE, community volunteers who have supported the development of the plan, also representatives from Clifton Emery Design and L & L Diverse Solutions.

A Neighbourhood Plan is a document that sets out local planning policies for a town, these policies are used to help decide whether to approve planning applications for new buildings or changes to existing buildings or infrastructure.

Torpoint started to develop its plan in March 2015. Public consultation events were held in 2015, 2017 and plan updates were explained at an event in 2023. The formal Regulation 14 Consultation on the plan started in 2023, further amendments were identified and changes made to the plan, with the formal Regulation 16 Consultation undertaken in January 2025. In October 2025 the public were invited to vote in

the Referendum, with over 88% of voters in support of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Town Mayor Councillor Julie Martin said "On behalf of Torpoint Town Council, thank you to everyone who has been involved in the development of the Torpoint Neighbourhood Plan. The plan is the outcome of much dedication and hard work over the last 11 years and demonstrates everyone's commitment to the cause. The result is a pretty unique partnership of a forward thinking Town Council, and the Strategic Planning Authority Cornwall Council working together to make a difference for the town."

In order to continue to push forward with key improvements in the town, whilst recognising the current cost of living challenges, the Town Council agreed an increase of 6.2% in the budget for 2026/27, to endeavour to ensure the financial stability of the Town Council.

The success of the Library and Community Hub continues and once again grant funding of £18,000 was secured, via Volunteer Cornwall, to continue to provide a community space and warmth hub. Opening hours are Monday to Friday, 0915 - 1630, with additional opening on the second Saturday of the month from 1000 to 1230 and from 1000 to 1400 on the last Sunday of every month, except December.

The play parks at Cambridge Field, Borough Farm, Chestnut Close and Thanckes Park Play Park continue to be maintained by the Operations Team, also Rendel, Sparrow and Bénodet Parks together with the Skate Park. The Town Council is working alongside Torpoint Ramps Forum (TRF) to award the tender for the right design and build team for the Skate Park, with works planned to commence in 2027. The fundraising campaign will be starting very soon. The partnership with the LTA (Lawn Tennis Association) continues, with plans to increase engagement with the schools and community groups. The Town Council currently has two Tennis Activators delivering sessions in Thanckes Park and are hoping to encourage more people to sign up to make 2026 as active as possible. The Council has two sports wheelchairs available for use on court 1, which is an accessible court. Annual membership fees and 'pay to play' court charges will remain the same in 2026/27.

The installation of three pieces of Accessible Play Equipment, into Cambridge Field and Borough Park Play Park commenced in early January 2026. Fundraising for this project has been very buoyant with many individuals

and local organisations contributing to the project, the council is very grateful for these donations. Once the work is completed an official opening event will be planned.

The Town Council continues to work in partnership with Cornwall Council to deliver suitable redevelopment of the lower end of Fore Street and has reached a major milestone in the completion of the Royal Institute of British Architects detailed design of the community hub, residential units and community square on the site of the old police station on Hooper Street. After having won the funding to complete the studies from the Good Growth Fund managed by Cornwall Council the Torpoint Town Project Board undertook a procurement exercise and selected Clifton Emery Design, an award winning group of Architects from Devon, to complete the work that represents an important element of the work being undertaken to regenerate the lower end of Fore Street, in Torpoint. An outline planning application was submitted to Cornwall Planning for the site, and has been approved with conditions in December '25.

In June '25 the Town Council secured £37,600 of additional funding from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund. The funding was allocated from Cornwall Council's Community Levelling Up Programme, which is part of the Cornwall and Isles of Scilly Good Growth Programme. The funding was bid for and won to create a programme of activity to support events that benefit the local community, all ages and for all needs. By using Community Levelling Up funding, the Town Council created a project which targets key locations, each with specific needs, and aims to enhance and repurpose these spaces to support the expanding events programme. Training new volunteers and purchasing affordable mobile equipment to ensure the sustainability of events was included in the project.

In October '25 voting on the referendum the Torpoint Parish Neighbourhood Plan took place, and it was declared that more than half of those voting have voted in favour of the Torpoint Parish Neighbourhood Plan. A celebration event to thank everyone involved is being organised by the Town Mayor in January '26.

The Town Council anticipates financially supporting the Torpoint and Rame Peninsula 9v9 3G All Weather Football Turf Pitch this year. This project is a collaborative effort between Torpoint Community College, the Town Council, Plymouth YMCA, Torpoint and Rame Active Community Network, Cornwall FA, and the Football Foundation. It aims to provide a state-of-the-art facility for the benefit of College students' and the wider community. In December '25 the project planning application was approved, Torpoint Community College will now continue to progress this project in collaboration.

In November '25, Torpoint Town Council resolved to adopt the Torpoint Arts and Culture Strategy and Action Plan as presented by the Torpoint Artists Collective consultant Lizzie Hilton, congratulating the consultant for producing and developing an insightful and coherent Strategy for the town. Next steps will be to collaborate with Torpoint Artists Collective regarding the Action Plan.

The Town Council has approved several proposals around equality, diversity and inclusion and this has resulted in the adoption of the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Policy and the council operating in accordance with the best practice document. The Torpoint Diverse Advisory Panel, which consists of Councillors and local residents living with a disability. If you are interested in joining the Diverse Advisory Panel, please contact the council offices. The Town Council has adopted a Climate Action Plan, which is on the home page of the Town Council website

The Town Council produce and distributes a Newsletter to all households in the town, it is anticipated this will continue to be produced four times per year with chargeable advertising space available.

The Town Council plans for 2026/27 to be a year of consolidation of projects, with the aspiration of existing projects coming to fruition.

Torpoint Council Chambers Facilities for Hire!

The Main Hall has a licence to facilitate up to 200 people standing and 120 seated. There is a stage and access to both the kitchen and bar. There is disabled access, a hearing loop and has Wi-Fi available.

The Committee Room is a room suitable for meetings of up to 80 people standing or 45 seated. The room is ideal for children's parties as there is plenty of space for a disco and can be used in conjunction with the bar area to serve refreshments. The room is fitted with a Hearing Loop system, a projector and screen and has Wi-Fi available.

The Mayor's Parlour, a comfortable room that can seat up to 12 people. It can be used for formal board room style meetings, training sessions, or informal meetings, The Mayor's Parlour is in a self-contained area with its own entrance on Buller Road.




