

These are the stats for the month 11/2/26 to 10/3/2026. I've also attached an explanatory document that lists the crimes that fall under each heading. On this month's stats there are a couple of areas that stand out, violence with injury and misc crimes against society. I have reviewed both. The violence with injury is dominated by offences of a domestic nature, whilst the miscellaneous crimes include a series of linked offences for youngsters sharing indecent images on social media, leading me to conclude that these spikes are not indicative of an increased risk to the wider community.
