Emergency resilience

A key priority for Cornwall is continual improvement in preparedness and resilience for emergencies. The importance of this has, of course, been brought into focus by the recent storms and we are working to evaluate the lessons of these for ourselves, partner agencies and communities.

Survey of Town & Parish Councils on the Storms

I would appreciate your help with completing a short survey on the impact of the storms in your parish. The purpose of this is to help us understand what worked well, in terms of the multi-agency and community response, and learn where improvements are needed for future severe weather events.
