Hello Milly

I am writing to update you on the outcome of the review of the 34 expressions of interest that were submitted to the South East Cornwall Community Highways Programme (CHIP).

Torpoint Town Council had submitted a proposal in relation to the A374 to Horson Field/New Cemetery entrance. But, unfortunately, due to the fact that the recent A374 Route Safety Review does not recommend your proposal as an option, this is not a scheme that was considered to be eligible and therefore will not be progressing.

However, if/when planning is secured for the field, changes to this area will need to be navigated via the planning system, which could also open up the possibility of s106 funding that could be secured/utilised for these proposals.

On a more positive note, the expression of interest submitted by Cllr Parsonage for parking restrictions and bollards at Salamanca Street/St James Road was eligible and will be progressing to the next stage of detailed costings being prepared. I will keep you updated on its progress – the final review is due to take place on 23rd June.
